

Michael Kilchling, Dr. jur., is a senior researcher at the Department of Public Law of the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Crime, Security and Law (previously: Max Planck Institute for Foreign and International Criminal Law) in Freiburg, Germany, and lecturer at the University of Freiburg.

His main research interests include penal sanctions and sanctioning systems, juvenile justice, victim/offender mediation and other forms of restorative justice, victimology, organized crime, money laundering and the financing of terrorism, confiscation and asset recovery, and procedural measures of investigation. He has been a member of several international expert groups such as the Crime Proofing Steering Group of the EU Commission, DG Justice and Home Affairs, the informal platform of experts of the European Commission on seizure, confiscation, freezing and asset recovery, the Group of Specialists on Assistance to Victims and Prevention of Victimization at the Council of Europe, the informal group of experts of the European Commission on victims of crime, and, most recently, a consultant to the group of experts on victims' rights commissioned by the Council of Europe's Committee on Crime Problems which prepared the pending draft for a renewed Recommendation on the rights, services and support for victims of crime. He has also been working at the International Monetary Fund in Washington, D.C., as visiting expert on European legislation on asset confiscation, and is connected with the Balkan Criminology Network. Recent research activities include empirical projects related to victim-offender mediation in prison, the transfer of victim protection measures from criminal procedure into civil procedures, the control of economic and industrial espionage in Europe, restrictions and disenfranchisement of certain civil and political rights after conviction in Europe (ongoing), and the conceptualization of a model for assessing the overall extent and impact of surveillance measures in Germany (ongoing).
